- Updating of the Server was performed.

- Troubleshooting of the voicemail system was performed as necessary.

- An ATC phone technician removed damaged phone lines in the Reference area and started 3 new lines; the phone and voicemail systems were reconfigured.
- Pipes in the ceiling of the Reference area were traced down to the Maintenance area, making it easier for new voice & data lines to be run.

- A new multi-function printer was purchased & installed in the IT office.
- Internal cleaning of the Graphics Xerox printer was performed.
- An iPad was repaired in the Youth Services area.
- Patron PCs in the Adult & Youth area were updated and cleaned.
- Measurements & diagraming of the new PC walkup area in Reference was done to determine where holes should be drilled in the floor for data & electrical needs.
- 2 new electrical boxes were installed for the Reference Desk data & voice lines.
- Computer class laptops were cleaned and updated.
- PAC station PCs were cleaned and had updates installed.

- A Staff PC in Adult Services was trouble-shooted to repair error messages.
- Ethernet cables in the floor & walls of the West wing were completely removed (500 ft.) and recycled.
- Further tracing of every Ethernet line in the building was done to prepare for rewiring the entire Network wiring closet.
- A new Ethernet line was run for installation of a new camera in the West Wing.
- In the process of obtaining an EZProxy server which allows patrons to login remotely for database access.
- Gathered quotes & planned for the 2018 Information Technology budget.
- Printer/toner usage stats were collected for July.
- Online program sign-up for July had 21 patrons, grand total -1002.
- Stats for July's Wireless Printing usage were collected; patrons & staff were assisted as needed.
- Troubleshooting of the Wi-Fi system as needed. Stats were collected for July.
- The Youth Service program room was re-configured for a day into a temporary computer lab for the Youth Service Minecraft program.
