- Updating of the Server was performed.

- Troubleshooting of the voicemail system was performed including defragmenting the hard drive.
- Troubleshooting of the phone system was performed.
- A phone was replaced in the Circulation backroom.
- Staff PCs were updated in AS, TS, YS, SS, and Circulation.
- PAC station PCs were cleaned and had updates installed.
- New staff PCs were built and deployed in the Administration office.
- Several Staff desk PCs had additional RAM installed.
- A Staff PC in AS was trouble-shooted to repair error messages.
- A network port went bad for a printer in the AS office. It was redirected to a functioning port.
- A Reference Desk PCs was transferred to a rolling desk to be used in the aisles of the Reference area during construction.
- A broken sound port was replaced on one of the patron walk-up PCs.
- Additional Ethernet cables were run from the Ethernet switch in Reader's Services to the new patron PC stations.
