We were proud to provide the Community Room, display cases, other marketing, and extensive technology support to the Rolling Meadows Historical Society/Museum for a well-attended program on December 4th where Esther Perica, author of the book *They Took the Challenge: the Story of Rolling Meadows*, gave a presentation on what went into the writing the book.

Pete has been upgrading the floor outlet boxes in the Garden Lounge so that the new boxes are flush with the floor. This improves safety, but also provides us with new opportunities for how we arrange the furniture in the Lounge. This way we can experiment and see what patrons seem to like best.

After consulting with President Threadgill, the decision was made to close the Library at 1pm on Thursday, and all day Friday, December 22-23. Hazardous weather, and concern for the safety of staff and patrons were the main influencers of the decision. The schools were out for the holiday break already, which was taken into account before deciding to close. We don't make closure decisions lightly. In order to make sure the community was informed, we used our enewsletter platform.
