Youth Services

- We have signed up well over 500 kids for the Summer Reading Challenge. The best sign up in years!
- We have held over 20 library programs, highlights include: Stop Motion Animation, Paint Our Windows, Pizza Pillow Party, Rainbow Lemonade STEM, Drop in Surprises and all of our Storytimes. All this in just the first 4 weeks of Summer.
- Our Educational Services Coordinator, Darlene E. has retired. We miss her tremendously.

Readers Services

- The Adult and Teen Summer reading program began on June 5. Our patron sign-up so far this year has surpassed that of our entire participation last year (291). We are currently at 370 and still counting!
- Our circulating board games collection became a reality this month. The new collection was previewed and promoted at the Summer Reading kickoff party on June 7.

Reference Services

- In conjunction with the youth department, Lauren V. hosted a new family program: seed balls (air-dried clay, seeds, soil, and then plant!).

Special Services

- After much preparation, the Summer Reading Challenge decor was completed on the main and lower levels. Jessica V. is responsible for the vision and execution of the appealing decorations throughout the library.
- The June concert was well attended. We had 62 people come to the library to enjoy the music of Jazz Spectrum on June 25.

Circulation

- We are participating in the Ravinia Festival's Words and Music program. We received 50 lawn passes to several classical concerts. Any patron who checks out six CDs is eligible to receive two free passes. All of the patrons who have participated have been very enthusiastic!
- We have begun checking out the board games and disc golf sets that were recently added to the collection. Several patrons have expressed their appreciation for these new items.
- We are thrilled to welcome Jessica E. to our staff. She is learning quickly, and we know she's going to be a great addition to our department.

Technical Services

- We added four disc golf sets to the Library of Things collection. The sets include everything you need for a family of four to play. With safety in mind, each disc has been labeled with our address and a statement saying if found please return. We want to prevent patrons from trying to retrieve discs that might have flown into the creek or other hazardous areas.
- The Vega Discover homepage has been updated. Highlights include the high school summer reading choices and biographies of the authors selected for reading in our book discussion groups.
- Our collection of board games have been changed to allow for checkouts. Velcro straps have been added to each game to keep the contents from spilling out when the game is traveling and when returned.
