Special Services

- We had a very good turnout for the October Arts Alive Concert featuring Danny Svehla who performed his Neil Diamond Tribute. Eighty people came to the library to enjoy the show. (SM)
- The annual student photo display that normally includes both Fremd and Rolling Meadows High Schools included only Fremd student work. RMHS was unable to participate this year. Two outstanding photos were chosen and the students will be recognized at the November 19 Arts Alive Concert. (SM)
- Jessica worked on the logo, game board, and decorations for the Winter Reading Challenge for Youth: *Birds of a Feather, Read Together*, which is scheduled to run from December 1, 2023 through February 29, 2024. (SM)
- The winter newsletter was completed and sent to the printer. (SM)

<u>Technology</u>

- All Envisionware Patron Printing System were rebuilt/repaired after Windows 10 updates caused operating issues. (MM)
- We have stopped using Google Vault (used for FOIA email compliance) because of the significant cost & complexity of use. We switched to SysCloud, which is easier to use, offers more functions and is much more cost-efficient. The change allows us to save \$9K/year. (MM)
- Completed the annual winter preparation for the outdoor cameras. Cleaned mounts, checked cables, checked seals, repainted each camera and took care of any repairs needed. (MM)

<u>Circulation</u>

- We disposed of the old date due cards that haven't been used since the pandemic. Thank you to maintenance for their help! (MS)
- Rokus remain popular. We currently have 37 holds on 9 Roku devices. (MS)
- Patrons place an average of 770 holds per month for books, DVDs, and CDs. (MS)
