

library news

*embrace the future,
remember the past* by Ashley

As you may have noticed over the past several months, the area just north of the Rolling Meadows Library is undergoing some major changes. The building that formerly held the AMF Bowl on Kirchoff Road is no longer standing, and a tall chain-link fence has gone up as construction crews work to transform the site into a residential area that will expand the city's community.

Once the residential site is complete, many people may likely refer to it as "the spot where the bowling alley used to be." But, as longtime residents know, before there was a bowling alley, there was another beloved institution in that same spot along Kirchoff Road: a big red barn that housed the Community Church of Rolling Meadows for many years.

Want to learn more? Come to the library and check out one of the library's **Rolling Meadows Adventure Packs!** Each **Adventure Pack** includes a backpack with a GPS unit, binoculars, and a booklet of stories and coordinates that will lead you around the city on four different historical hikes. To begin your hike through local history, simply bring your Rolling Meadows Library card and drivers' license to the library and ask to check out an **Adventure Pack**.
