
books

With her signature style, Anna Quindlen captures the struggles of a family's life, legacy and future in the face of uncertainty in ***Miller's Valley***. You'll be immersed in the complex characters, rich story line and an ending full of twists and turns.

The Fireman by Joe Hill is an epic novel set in a post-apocalyptic world and explores the dichotomy of fear and hope. This title, along with Hill's other books, can be found in print, audio and on *My Media Mall*.

With your library card and a computer you have access to the library 24/7. Login to your RML Account anytime to renew your library books or put a book on hold and it will be waiting for you at the Circulation Desk to check out when the library is open. You can even check out books when the library is closed! On the library's website (www.rmlib.org), the "Quick Link" *eBooks & More* takes you to the *My Media Mall* site. Use your library card to sign in and you can check out eBooks and audiobooks anytime.

Would you like to read a magazine? Zinio is an application that lets you download an electronic magazine to your computer or tablet to read anytime.

Here are just some of the other things you can do using your Library card:

- Find a good book to read or get a list of the titles in a series by using NoveList Plus.
- Check up on a dentist or plumber with Consumers' Checkbook or see how Consumer Reports rates an oven.
- Learn about a new diagnosis or medical procedure with Medline Plus.
- Find a lawyer or fill out your own lease agreement on the Legal Forms database.
- Fix your car using Chilton Library online.
- Look up a business or create a mailing list for yours using Reference USA.
- Research your ancestors with Heritage Quest and Obituaries; Death Notices. (Ancestry Library Edition is available to use too; but only inside the Library).
- Want to learn a language? Mango Languages will teach you and even track your progress.

Start discovering your Library Card's potential! Go to the library's website (www.rmlib.org), choose Online Resources from the "Quick Links" menu and click on the Resource you want to explore. You will be prompted to login using the barcode on the back of your Library Card and the PIN you use to access your RML Account.


