





#### **Spotlight on Genealogy Resources** Available at RML

Whether you're just getting started or have been working on your family history for a while, we have books on the shelf at 929.1 to help.

Ancestry.com is available for in-library use, with access to most of its features. You can sign up as a registered user to track some of your research without a paid membership, or e-mail items to yourself.

HeritageQuest is accessible both from the library and from home via our website. It includes a number of digitized books as well as a number of federal records.

Newspapers, especially local ones, often hold a wealth of unexpected details. We subscribe to the Chicago Tribune Historical Records, NewsBank, NewsBank's HeritageHub, and the New York Times. The digital records for the Daily Herald only go back to 1995, but we have older ones on microfilm if you need them. There's also the Library of Congress' Chronicling America, which gathers historical newspapers from all over the nation.

We subscribe to Hoopla and Kanopy, and you can find genealogy programs to watch at your leisure there - all you need is your library card and PIN!
