The son, a nuclear scientist who could hold the key to America's secret weapons program, is being hunted by a Nazi spy and an American journalist. The race is on to see who will be the first to find him.

Author Carol Cassella, M.D. offers a medical mystery that drives an ICU doctor to confront ethical dilemmas with her science journalist boyfriend. **Gemini** is captivating, heartbreaking, and unforgettable.

Debut author Pierce Brown brings an immersive dystopia to life in **Red Rising**, where one young man struggles to ascend the ranks of his color-oriented caste society, by any means necessary. Particularly recommended for fans of **Ender's Game** and **The Hunger Games** trilogy.

In **The Missing Dough**, the latest in the **Pizza Lover Mystery** series by Chris Cavender, Eleanor Swift is searching for clues in her brother-in-law's death while running her pizzeria as well as preparing for the big Founders' Day Festival.
