2015 legacy project

The RML Legacy Project honors volunteers who have made an extraordinary contribution to the growth and maintenance of the Rolling Meadows Library. Up to three worthy candidates are chosen annually. This year's honorees are:

Marsha Kremer, Board Member 1999 to present

Marsha Kremer was a staff member at RML for five years in the late 70s/early 80s and chose to come back in a volunteer capacity as she neared retirement. She currently serves as the Library Board Secretary and Chair of the By-Laws Committee, as well as a member of the Heritage and Development Committees. She also formerly served as a member of the Personnel Committee. Marsha says, "I feel the library is an integral part of any community, one [that] can be utilized and enjoyed throughout one's lifetime. Being part of the process is extremely satisfying."

Adrienne Lee Rubinkowski, Friend 1991 to present

I usually have at least three books going at any given time, just in case there's a spare minute or two in which to lose myself in a book."
