

Abraham Lincoln and Joshua Speed join forces to solve a murder mystery in Jonathan Putnam's **These Honored Dead**, and what sounds like a far-fetched premise becomes a beautifully researched historical whodunit that makes it easy to root for the team of lawyer and merchant.

What's better than one story by Alexander McCall Smith? **Chance Developments** features five captivating tales of life and love using old "orphaned photographs" and their subjects as inspiration.

In **Vinegar Girl**, a contemporary retelling of the Shakespeare play *The Taming of the Shrew*, Anne Tyler captures all that is good about the heroine Kate and imbues her with more modern sensibilities. This book will delight fans of Tyler and Shakespeare alike and can be found in print form as well as on *My Media Mall*.






Steve Justman:


Library Expansion Approved!

The Library Board approved a 1,625 square foot expansion of the West Wing (near Salt Creek). The expansion will include two small-group meeting rooms and a large flexible use room, tentatively named the Garden Lounge. Each small-group meeting room will seat five and include a large, wall-mounted flat-screen for presentations from your laptop, and white board walls to allow maximum creativity for your meeting participants. The Garden Lounge will include comfortable seating, recharging stations for your mobile devices, a vending area, and a fireplace. This space will also be available for the library to stage special events.

The \$830,000 project will be paid for by combining funds from the 2016 levy with capital reserves that have been built up over the past several years. The Board's goals were to keep the levy increase at or below 3% and to complete the project without creating debt. The library budget was approved with a 2.7% increase, and the project will create no debt. The average tax increase per resident will be about \$1.46.
