

## Here is the Beehive

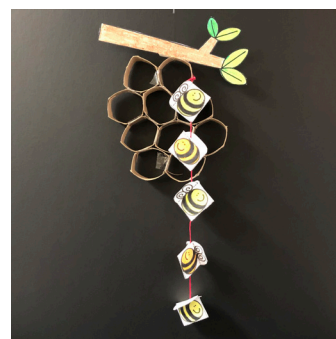
Here is the beehive.

One, two, three, four, five!

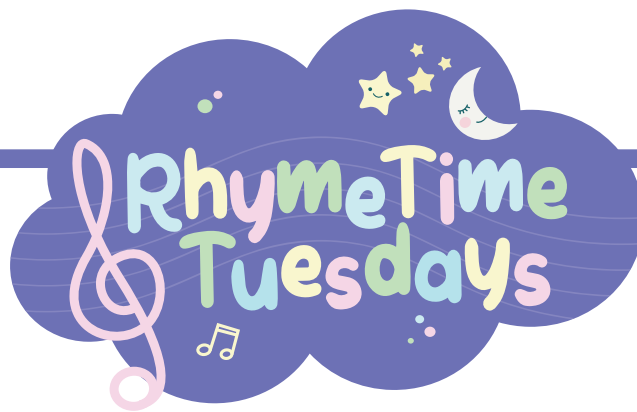
Buzzing up high. Buzzing down low.

# CRAFT

## You will need:

- Glue, tape or stapler
- Markers or Crayons
- Scissors
- Cardboard tube  
(from paper towel or aluminum foil roll)
- 24" of String



## Instructions:

1. Print page 3.
2. Color the bees and the branch.
3. Cut the pair of bees as one shape on the solid lines and cut the branch with its tab.
4. Fold the bees and branch on the dotted lines.
5. Cut the cardboard roll into 10 rings about the same size.
6. Gently press the rings into 6 sided shapes.
7. Tape the rings together to make a honeycomb.
8. Glue the branch to the top of the honeycomb.
9. Glue the bees onto the string.
10. Tie the string onto the honeycomb.
