

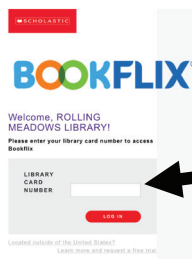

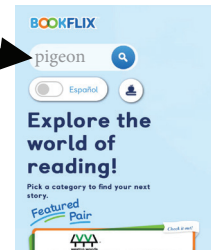

Storytime To Go Birds

You will need:

paper plate
glue
markers or crayons

Directions:

1. Go outside and collect some leaves, grass and flower petals. Try to find different sizes and colors.



2. Fold your plate in half.
3. Draw some eyes with markers or crayons.
4. Add a tail.



5. Glue on leaves and petals to decorate your bird.



6. Make sure you let your glue dry before you stand up your bird!

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
