WATERMELON PAPER FAN
Supplies:
paper plate large craft stick tape
Pink, green and black crayons or markers

1. Make sure the bottom of the paper plate is facing up.

2. Color the center of the plate pink.

3. Open the plate and use tape to attach the craft stick for the handle.

4. Color the bumpy rim of the plate green.

5. An adult can staple around the outer rim of the plate to seal the edges.
6. Color the black dots for seeds on top of the pink center.

7. Stay cool with your fun fan!
