Paper Plate Banjo

You'll need: two sturdy paper plates two to three rubber bands one paint stir stick (these are often free at the hardware store) tape and glue Optional: crayons, markers, stickers (to decorate your banjo)

Instructions:

- Decorate the paper plate if you wish with material you have on hand.
- Glue the two paper plates together.
- Tape the paint stir stick in the middle of the back of the plate, this will be the neck of your banjo.
- Put three to two rubber bands around the plates long ways.
