

differences between courtships of the past
and present.

February 2, 2017 Did You Ever Have A Family

by Bill Clegg

Surviving a disaster that kills everyone else in her family, June relocates West and settles into a directionless existence while other people impacted by the tragedy struggle with new circumstances.

March 2, 2017 The Golden Son

by Shilpi Somaya Gowda
After his father dies, Anil Patel, an Indian
doctor doing his medical residency in Texas, becomes the head of his family's small
village back home, while his childhood
friend, Leena, struggles with the difficulties
of an arranged marriage.

April 6, 2017 The Sisters Brothers

by Patrick deWitt

Set against the back-drop of the great California Gold Rush, this darkly comic novel follows the misadventures of the fabled Sisters brothers, two hired guns, who, under the order of the mysterious Commodore, try to kill Hermann Kermit Warm, a man who gives them a run for their money.

May 4, 2017 Being Mortal: Medicine and What Matters in the End by Atul Gawande

A prominent surgeon argues against modern medical practices that extend life at the expense of quality of life while isolating the dying, outlining suggestions for freer, more fulfilling approaches to death that enable more dignified and comfortable choices.

June 1, 2017 Georgia: A Novel of Georgia O'Keefe by Dawn Tripp

A tale inspired by the romance between painter Georgia O'Keeffe and photographer Alfred Stieglitz describes how a young O'Keeffe becomes the married photographer's mistress and muse as her star rises in the art world.
